Newly Constructed Addition for a Maternity Delivery Room!

This 4 bed Maternity Delivery room will be a significant upgrade not only in the capacity, but also the quality of care given to mothers in this remote isolated region.

The Malek Christian Hospital was opened by South Sudan African Mission in October of 2009 to meet the medical needs of the Sudanese who have no access to Healthcare other than a hospital over 1 hour driving time away. For those able to access vehicles, not walk!

1 Hour Driving, DURING THE DRY SEASON! During the rainy season nearly 100,000 people were cut off from the hospital in Aweil.

The single delivery room currently in the hospital is aging, because of 45-55 mothers per month currently giving birth in the single room at the Malek Hospital. Although worn, the care being given is providing healthy, infection free births that include child care training and evangelism!

Dr. John Kuot, the Sudanese overseeing Physician says, "We are pursuing the great commission and we don't feel good when the mother and children we are supposed to help are getting infections or risk getting infection at our facility. These upgrades will allow us to give quality care WITH the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ."

THE MISSION

The South Sudan African Mission (SSAM) began in 1988 when Paul and Marilyn Douglass went to Khartoum, Sudan. They established a mobile workshop in Sudan to repair hospital equipment, but no one in the country was trained to operate it. Because of Paul's abilities and his Master of Science degree, he was accepted by the Sudanese government to teach the native men to use the mobile workshop.

As a result of South Sudan African Mission, Aweil Bible College was founded and in 2007 eighteen graduated from that first class.

Then in October of 2009, Malek Christian Hospital, funded by SSAM, opened their doors to serve the community in the name of Jesus. Currently, Medical Evangelism is being used by not only the Malek Christian Hospital, but by Mobile Medical and Evangelism teams as well which go village to village. Students of ABC have become active participants in the Mobile Evangelism and Medical Teams.
