THE PROJECT

FAME has partnerships all over the world with those that are bringing help and hope to those who desperately need healthcare and the gospel. We now have a new partnership with an organization called Remember the Children. They have been working for many years in Romania and recently expanded their work to Tanzania. Remember the Children is a ministry that is focused on providing housing and families for orphans. There are 3.1 Million Orphan children in Tanzania because of Aids and Malaria.

They have already built ten homes in the village of Malolo. Each home has the capacity to house twelve children and their parents and they are filled to capacity. Homes 11 and 12 are currently under construction. A church has been started to meet the spiritual needs of the children and the community. The church started with six people and is now running 120-150. They baptized 20 people in July! A school has been started to provide for their education. It has a capacity of 600 children and is currently at 270.



FAME has committed \$30,000 toward the \$44,000 needed to construct the clinic.

Your continued partnership with FAME will help orphans and so many more!!

There is very limited access to healthcare in Tanzania and particularly in this area. So, Remember the Children is building a healthcare clinic to meet the medical needs of the orphans, the school children and the people in their local community. The clinic will be built next door to the church because they want to connect the physical ministry of the clinic with the spiritual ministry of the church.

THE NEED

The Pastor of the local church said, *We as a Church intend to use this opportunity to reach all who will come to access medical care, including those who are desperate for life, to tell how Jesus is the best Father to the Fatherless, how He is a help to the helpless, how He is hope to those who have no hope. Malolo is predominantly Muslim so the need for the gospel is great.* He goes on to say,

Tabora and Tanzania at large is among an area in Africa where healthcare is very poor. Because of this fact, there have been various reports of frequent deaths, especially for young children, pregnant women and the elderly. People in this area lack access to nearby health facilities or have no health services at all available to them. In this context, the church began to ask God to help with a health care center, which would work under the Church. The aim being to save the lives of the groups mentioned above, as well as to ensure that the gospel of Jesus Christ reaches these groups when they come to access medical care.

In the Tabora area, there is only one small government clinic serving more than six villages. This situation makes people walk long distances, even more than 20 to 30 km to receive health care. Due to the shortage of medical equipment and supplies, it is unable to meet the requirements for quality care. Testing services for various diseases, including malaria, as well as the lack of quality care for pregnant women are among the most important medical needs to date, an issue that results in many childhood deaths, as well as pregnant women.

The existence of a clinic near the Church will help the ministry introduce people to the Good News of Jesus Christ. The clinic will recognize the Church and provide people who receive medications and medical care an opportunity to join church services which in the end can change their spiritual life.

We know that poverty can bring stress to people, but it is clear that the situation can be worse when one has no hope and the right way of life, which is brought about by the salvation of Jesus Christ.

It is my prayer to God that he can help us achieve this, so that we can partly be comfort and be answers to some victims.

May God bless all those who are touched by this and decide to help. Amen.
